From The Minister

Grateful Renewal

This Sunday will be my last time preaching and helping to lead worship until September as I am gratefully and excitedly beginning a three-month sabbatical on Monday. Thanks to the faithful wisdom of the Session members who, years ago, established a sabbatical fund at FPC, I will be able to finally begin a writing project I have been researching and mulling over since 2007.

The Presbytery of Middle Tennessee has a sabbatical policy which applies to all congregations with full-time Ministers of Word and Sacrament like me as well as Certified Ruling Elders serving for at least six years. Below is a portion of the PMT sabbatical policy which gives a nice overview of what this is all about:

"A Sabbatical has its roots in the Bible. Sabbatical means to rest or to break from work. The biblical pattern of 6 days of work and 1 day of rest served to identify the people of God...This paid time away is intended for refreshment and renewal, both for the servant and for the congregation. The servant withdraws temporarily from the spiritual and emotional demands of ministry. A Sabbatical might be used to travel, pursue a passion, volunteer in a mission, study, or relax and renew. Sabbaticals can help avoid burnout and increase energy and vision for future ministry."

Our Session, staff, and I have made plans which will ensure the continued pastoral care, worship and other leadership will be in place for the congregation while I am away for the summer. The Rev. Judy Arnold from Westminster Presbyterian Church in Fairfield Glade will serve as the moderator of our Session for the three meetings during the summer and the pulpit will be ably filled by The Rev. Katie Ory, Cade Arnold, Kelly Appleton, The Rev. Lisa Herman, and The Rev. Jeannie Hunter. In addition to the care provided by our Deacons, Katie will also be available during the week for pastoral care needs, adding another to the many hats she already wears.

By no means will the summer be less active as we will have a super fun Wednesday night Cricuts and Crafts gathering next week, we will have another wonderful tent at the Pride festival on June 7th, Dr. Robert Owens will lead an excellent program called Race, Racism, and Civil Rights in the U.S. Past and Present on Tuesday afternoons in June, Thriving Congregations work will continue, and our Mission committee will be hosting the wonderful new Giving Griddle meals on a Wednesday evening and a Saturday brunch in June. 



The class will be explore the ideology of race and the outgrowth of racism in America from the early years immediately following the abolition of slavery to the present day. This class will also view civil rights efforts in the United States in its close connection to racism. There will be some additional exploration of the involvement of the Church in the American civil rights movement.

Robert Owens has worked for years in Access and Diversity at Tennessee Tech University. In January of 2020, Owens was appointed Interim Vice President of Student Affairs at TTU. He serves as Chief Diversity Officer at Tech and in July of 2024, he became Senior Executive for Access and Community Outreach. Dr. Owens has helped TTU reach its highest levels of ethnic diversity in history. He has given presentations about TTU's retention programming for students of color across the United States.

In addition to his work at TTU, Dr. Owens's serves as Pastor of a multi-ethnic church situated in the heart of Cookeville, TN; has served on boards of he Cookeville-Putnam County Chamber of Commerce and Highlands Residential Services (formerly the Cookeville Housing Authority); and coaches middle and high school boys basketball.

Creek, a PhD student in the FEW program, recommended this upgrade to our garden. TTU FEW students can help assemble the tumbler.


Look forward to composting food and flowers for the garden!
